

Welcome

Welcome to the Georgia Southern University's Armstrong Campus Arboretum. The Arboretum encompasses Armstrong's 250 acre campus and displays over 150 species of trees and over 300 species of shrubs and other woody plants. Developed areas of campus contain native and introduced species of trees and shrubs, the majority of which are labeled. Natural areas of campus contain plants typical in Georgia's coastal broadleaf evergreen forests such as live oak, southern magnolia, red ray, horse sugar, and sparkleberry.

Purpose

 The function of the Arboretum can be divided into four areas; teaching, conservation, community outreach, and recreation.

Teaching

 The Arboretum provides an outdoor laboratory for use by faculty and students in Botany, Biology, Environmental Studies, Photography, Art, and other departments.



Conservation

The Arboretum functions as a sanctuary for the preservation and conservation of plants.
 With collections of native and exotic flora, the Arboretum provides a model for environmentally sound urban landscape management.



Community Outreach

The Arboretum allows the university to provide botanical and horticultural information to the community. Educational opportunities can be provided in the form of workshops, demonstrations, and tours. Maps, and plant guides allow the public to explore the Arboretum on their own.

- One of approximately 100-250 species of evergreen shrubs and small trees native to eastern Asia





Process

- Each stake is cut to 15" from 8' aluminum sticks
- Once cut to length, we then cut the stake to a point to penetrate the ground
- We then bend the other end of the stake at an angle so the plant label can be easily read
- Once the stake is complete, we adhere a plant tag with double sided tape


We are currently using a Laser Solution LS100 "Gravograph"
