**Kim Coder, Ph.D.,** Professor of Tree Biology & Health Care, University Hill Fellow for Distinguished Public Service & Outreach, Warnell School of Forestry and Natural Resources, University of Georgia, Athens

We are pruning trees too much and in the wrong way, which is costing us time, money, and tree lives. Making trees more prone to failure is not effective management. Simple observations can help determine actual pruning needs.
