BIRDS: 425 species


AMPHIBIANS: 80 species

REPTILES: 90 species


FRESHWATER FISH: 325 species

INVERTEBRATES:


THOUSANDS of species, more than all vertebrate classes combined

Habitat Loss is the #1 Reason for Species Decline




Other Threats to Wildlife

State Wildlife Action Plan (SWAP)



A strategy to conserve wildlife and their habitats *before* these animals, plants and places become rarer and more costly to conserve or restore.

- Lists 349 animals and 290 plant species as high priorities for conservation.
- Includes 150 recommended actions to focus efforts where they're most needed and most effective.








General Wildlife Control Tactics

Limit food availability

- Empty trash cans/dumpsters regularly, control rodents, eliminate insects in siding, etc.



Repellants & scare tactics (limited success though)

- Sulfur powder for snakes, Milorganite for deer, inflatables, etc.


Physical exclusion

- Fencing for deer, hardware cloth for bats, tall grass for geese, well manicured landscape to reduce food/shelter for snakes

Lethal methods – Know the laws & consider consequences

- Species/season limitations + county/city ordinances
- Permits may be available to take certain species out of season
