Tour 1 - Tour King's Trail to view unique tree habitat, review tree ID, and learn about successes and issues of caring for an urban forest while also hosting high numbers of visitors every year. This ¾ mile loop walk will be led by Bill Lott of the Thompson Mill State Arboretum and Stone Mountain Memorial Association (SMMA) staff.

Tour 2 - Get a guided tour of Stone Mountain Park's landmark trees: the live oak, cedar, and cypress trees along the lake, the oak at Historic Square, the champion Osage-orange, and then the hemlocks at the Harold Cox Nature Garden. This tour, led by Naomi Thompson of the SMMA, is a bus tour and includes an optional short, easy hike through the 3/4 mile loop Harold Cox Nature Garden.

Tour 3 – For those who crave more ambitious afternoon exercise, SMMA staff will lead a hike up Stone Mountain to talk about succession at a few weathering pits, see the Georgia Oaks along the way, review some unique forested sections, and say hello to the Old Man Cedar. In the interest of time, the group will only hike up and take the Skyride down. Tour starts with a quick introduction in the geology and ecology museum.
