Learn about the history of the Wesleyan College Arboretum and how Wesleyan faculty, staff, and students use the arboretum for teaching, research, conservation, and outreach to the Macon community.

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Jim Ferrari is a Professor and Chair of Biology at Wesleyan College, in Macon, Georgia. His Ph.D. is in Ecology from the University of Minnesota, and his undergraduate degree in Biology is from Middlebury College, Vermont. At Wesleyan, Jim teaches Ecology, Evolution, Conservation Biology, Field Biology, and related courses. He is also the Director of the Wesleyan College Arboretum, a Level-II accredited arboretum. Jim's research interests include forest ecology, fruit-eating and seed dispersal by birds, and behavior of birds at water sources. Jim is the past-president of both the Ocmulgee Audubon Society and the Georgia Ornithological Society (GOS); in addition, he is the editor of The Oriole, the scientific journal of GOS.

Joe Burnam is a Senior Wildlife Biologist with the Wildlife Conservation Section of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources. Joe earned a BS in Education and MS in Wildlife Ecology and Management from the University of Georgia. With DNR since 2008, he works primarily with the threatened red-cockaded woodpecker and other birds of conservation concern on state and private land in South Georgia. He also helps burn and manage upland pine habitat on southwest Georgia Wildlife Management Areas. Joe lives in Cairo with his wife Molly, two almost grown kids, and an old bird dog.



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
